2.24.050 Meetings. The plan commission shall meet at such times as it may by majority vote determine upon as regular meeting dates; or at any time upon call by the chairman thereof or by any four members thereof. (§7 of Ord. dated 6/2/69).

2.24.060 Records. The plan commission shall keep written records of its proceedings which shall be open to inspection by the village board of trustees at all times. (§6 of Ord. dated 6/2/69).

2.24.070 Conformance of subdivision plats required. No map or plat of any subdivision presented for record, affecting land within the corporate limits of the village, after the adoption of the official plan, shall be entitled to record or shall be valid unless the subdivision shown thereon conforms with the applicable provisions of the official plan and applicable requirements of the village zoning ordinance, on file in the office of the village clerk, and Title 16. (§5 of Ord. dated 6/2/69).

2.28.010 Definitions. For purposes of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. "Civil emergency" means:
  1. A riot or unlawful assembly characterized by

the use of actual force or violence or any threat to use force if accompanied by immediate power to execute by three or more persons acting together without authority of law; or

2. Any natural disaster or manmade calamity, including flood, conflagration, cyclone, tornado, earthquake or explosion within the corporate limits of the village, resulting in the death or injury of persons or the destruction of property to such an extent that extraordinary measures must be taken to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

B. "Curfew" means a prohibition against any person or persons walking, running, loitering, standing or motoring upon any alley, street, highway, public property or vacant premises within the corporate limits of the village, excepting officials of any governmental unit and persons officially designated to duty with reference to a civil emergency. (§1 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.020 Construction of provisions. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to impair the powers contained in this code giving powers to the police and fire departments, but shall be construed together with existing ordinances now in effect for the safety and welfare of the citizens of the village. (§9 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.030 Declaration of emergency. Whenever an emergency, as defined in Section 2.28.010, exists, the president shall declare the existence by means of a written declaration setting forth the facts which constitute the emergency. (§2 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.040 General curfew. After proclamation of a civil emergency by the president, he may order a general curfew applicable to such geographical areas of the village, or to the village as a whole, as he deems advisable and applicable during such hours of the day or night as he deems necessary in the interest of public safety and welfare. (§3 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.050 Additional orders. After the proclamation of a civil emergency, the president of the village may also, in the interest of public safety and welfare, make any or all of the following orders:

A. Order the closing of all retail liquor stores, including taverns and private clubs or portions thereof wherein the consumption of intoxicating liquor and beer is permitted;

B. Order the discontinuance of the sale of alcoholic liquor by any wholesaler or retailer;

C. Order the discontinuance of selling, distributing or giving away gasoline or other liquid flammable or combustible products in any container other than a gasoline tank properly affixed to a motor vehicle;

D. Order the discontinuance of selling, distributing, dispensing or giving away any firearms or ammunition of any character whatsoever;

E. Issue such other orders as are imminently necessary for the protection of life and property. (§4 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.060 Effective period of proclamation. The proclamation authorized by this chapter shall be effective for a period of forty-eight hours unless sooner terminated by a proclamation of the president indicating that the civil emergency no longer exists. The president shall have the power to reproclaim the existence of a civil emergency at the end of each forty-eight-hour period during the time the civil emergency exists. (§1 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.070 Notification of news media and posting of proclamation. Upon issuing the proclamation authorized by this chapter, the chief of police shall notify the news media situated within the village, and shall notify such other news media situated within the county as the president, in his discretion, directs, and shall cause three copies of the proclamation declaring the existence of the emergency to be posted at the following places within the village: the village hall, the fire station and the post office. (§6 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).

2.28.080 Penalty for violation. Any person violating the provisions of this chapter, or any executive order issued pursuant to this chapter, shall be guilty of an offense against the village, and shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars. (§7 of Ord. dated 6/1/70).
