ORDINANCE NO. 86-1

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tolono is authorized by statute to establish traffic-control regulations; and

WHEREAS, under the statutes of the State of Illinois, and the codified ordinance of the Village of Tolono authorize the Board of Trustees to cause appropriate stop signs to be erected when the Board of Trustees deem the same to be in the interest of health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the intersection of Holden and Condit Streets has become dangerous for both vehicular traffic and pedestrians, and said intersection requires protective measures.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Village President and the unanimous vote of the Village Trustees of Tolono, as follows:


SECTION 1: The Board of Trustees hereby designates said intersection as one where a stop sign should be installed at the northwest corner of the intersection of Holden and Condit Streets, which will require vehicles traveling southward on Condit Street to come to a full stop before proceeding further in any direction.

SECTION 2: That the Village staff is hereby authorized to acquire and to install a standard, state approved, octagon stop sign at said intersection, and upon installation the driver of all motor vehicles shall observe and comply with said stop sign by coming to a full stop before proceeding or otherwise become subject to the penalty for violation of traffic controls as provided by both statute and ordinance.
