VILLAGE OF TOLONO, ILLINOIS 1999 PREVAILING WAGE ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. 99-P-

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tolono, Illinois investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Tolono, Illinois employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Tolono, Illinois.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TOLONO, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Tolono, Illinois is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Champaign County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, a copy of the determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Tolono, Illinois to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Tolono, Illinois this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

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he following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply:

ys which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the propriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after hanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

XPLANATION OF CLASSES

SBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems re to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished t the time or at some close future date.

SBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems re to remain.

ELECOM WORKER

lass 1. Installing, assembling and maintaining sound and intercom, protection alarm (security), master antenna television, closed circuit elevision, computer hardware and software programming and installation to the network's outlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and able termination work historically performed by wiremen), door monitoring and control, nurse and emergency call programming and installation o the system's outlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and cable termination work historically performed by wiremen), clock and iming; and the installation and maintenance of transmit and receive antennae, transmitters, receivers, and associated apparatus which perates in conjunction with the above systems. All work associated with these system installations will be included EXCEPT (1) installation f protective metailic conduit, excluding less than ten-root runs strictly for protection of cable, and (2) 120 volt AC (or higher) power

RUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

lass 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by eparate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, cols, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

lass 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor rucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination nits, and ticket writers.

1. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working intervention units.

lass 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

lass 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

lass 1. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers with Skip, ournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Holst with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom or Winch Truck, inch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crane, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine n Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Plant ngineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant Engineer, CMI or similar type machine, oncrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Tower Crane, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer, Ditching Machine with dual ttachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Cherry Picker, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement achine, Back Filler, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling achines, Motor Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head quipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Point System), Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush ulcher, Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Boat Operator, efrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart- Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Float, Finishing achine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Lull (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Overhead Crane, hip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, Fork Lifes (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Seaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, nd similar types of equipment), Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, ackhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type), Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking hears, Water Blaster.

'or definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If there is no such definition on file, the Bureau of Labor Statistics SIC list will be used. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and

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ovide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. Further, if no such neighboring county rate applies to e track, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this institution. NDSCAPING

ndscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape anteman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer.
