VILLAGE OF TOLONO, ILLINOIS 2003 PREVAILING WAGE ORDINANCE

Ordinance No. <u>03-04</u>

June 3, 2003

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tolono, Illinois investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Tolono, Illinois employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Tolono, Illinois.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TOLONO, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Tolono, Illinois is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Champaign County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, a copy of the determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Tolono, Illinois to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village of Tolono, Illinois this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Village of Tolono, Illinois Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, or a Notice of Determination of Prevailing Wage Rates, as provided by statute, notifying the public that this ordinance was enacted and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

CHAMPAIGN COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply; New Years Day, Mamorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given loyal may older cortain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Vetarans Day. If in doubt, please thack with IDOL.

Oil and thip recealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate thips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASSESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where these mechanical systems are to be rameved. This includes the removal of asbestos materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close. Putter date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, duets, and ballers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazza mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work socianments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Caramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Coramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installing, assembling and malataining sound and intercom, protection alarm (security), master automat (slevinion, closed circuit television, computer hardware and software programming and installation to the network's outlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and cable termination work historically performed by wiramen), door manitoring and control, murse and emergency call programming and installation to the system's outlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and cable termination work historically performed by wiraman), clock and liming; and the installation and maintenance of transmit and receive antennas, transmitters, receivers, and associated apparatus which operates in conjunction with the above systems. All work associated with these system installations will be included EXCEPT (1) installation of protective metallic conduit, excluding less than ten-foot runs strictly for protection of cable, and (3) 120 volt AC (or higher) power wiring and associated hardware.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axis trucks housing less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, werehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks whom houling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job elte, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axis trucks hashing more than 9 ton but having less than 16 ton. A-frame wisch trucks, hydrolift frucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for trumportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 ib. capacity, winch trucks, four axis combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axis trucks handing 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks,

mechanics and working forspersons, and dispatchers. Five axie or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oli Distributors.

Class. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous wasta work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall excompass laborars, workers and mochanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, allo, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job sites distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock pilling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Receiving) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class I. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Gradalls, Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadoser, Concrete Mixers with Skip, Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Holst with Tower or Boom, Cableways, Tower Machines, Meter Patrel, Beem Tractor, Boom er Winch Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crase, Tournapull, Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tructor, Asphalt Planer, Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Lurge Rollers on Earth, Rollers on Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Processing Machine, Asphalt Mani Esgineer, Paver Operator, Dredging Equipment, or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Control Min Plant Engineer, CMI or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid Mounted, Tower Crane, Engineer or Back Crusher Plant, Concrete Plant Engineer, Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Loaders, Cherry Picker, Hydre Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives. Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Seil Cement Machine, Back Filter, Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Well Testing, Calseson, Shaft or any similar type drilling machines, Metar Driven Paint Machine, Pips Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping Machine, Pipe Bending Machine, Apoce Paver, Bering Machine. (Head Equipment Greaser), Barber-Greene Landers, Fermices Paver, (Well Paint System), Cuncrate Spraader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Mulcher, Brush Burner, Mech Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug Beat Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Cart- Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grader, Bull Fleat, Pinishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, Luit (or similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hooked in Manifold, Overhead Crans, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Bull-Air, Fork Lifts (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stobilizer (Scaman Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gaior, and similar types of equipment). Tube Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Milling Machine, Speeper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (with attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar type). Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Water Binster.

Class 3. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditching Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Towar or Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mounted Post Hele Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding Machines, within 406 feet, Air Compressor 600 cm. ft. and under, Robers on Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for lendscaping work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Oilers, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack, Mud Jack, Gunnito Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material, Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Couveyor, Siphons and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman on Asphalt Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Power Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Coment Plant, Equipment Greeser, Dock Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Driver, Coment Blimps, Form Grader, Temperary Heat, Throttle Valve, Super Sucker (and similar type of equipment).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are

available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being doesned to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 618/993-7271 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landsenping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating angineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
