

Chapter 5.08BILLIARD ROOMS AND BOWLING ALLEYS\*Sections:

- 5.08.010 License--Required.
- 5.08.020 License--Tax.
- 5.08.030 Permitting minors prohibited--Penalty.
- 5.08.040 Opening on Sunday prohibited--Penalty.

5.08.010 License--Required. No person shall keep any billiard table, bagatelle table or a ball or pin alley within the corporate limits of the village, to be used or played upon by others for hire or gain, without a license therefor under a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each person who may be permitted to play thereon for hire or gain. (§1 of Ord. dated 5/27/1878).

5.08.020 License--Tax. There shall be taxed and collected, for a license to keep billiards or bagatelle tables, ten dollars per table per year. (Amended 5/3/1954; §2 of Ord. dated 5/27/1878).

5.08.030 Permitting minors prohibited--Penalty. No keeper of a billiard table or ball or pin alley shall suffer or permit any minor to frequent or loiter about the premises occupied by him or her, or to roll or play upon his or her table or alley, without the previous consent of the parent, master or guardian of such minor, under a penalty of not less than fifteen dollars and a forfeiture of his or her license. (§3 of Ord. dated 5/27/1878).

5.08.040 Opening on Sunday prohibited--Penalty. Whoever, on Sunday, keeps open any billiard room, ball or pin alley, house, ground or other place of amusement, or suffers or permits persons to assemble therein for the purpose of amusement or play, shall be subject to a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense. (§4 of Ord. dated 5/27/1878).
